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George County guidelines on residential & business storm debris

Hurricane Zeta: Monday, November 2, 2020

To facilitate storm debris removal, George County residents and business owners can place debris along the roadside in the right-of-way for the unincorporated areas.

Please, do not block the roadway or place debris on top of fire hydrants or utility connections (phone, internet, gas).

Storm debris should be separated in piles based on the following type of materials:

- Vegetative Debris: tree trunks, branches, logs, plants, limbs, etc.
- Construction Debris: lumber, shingles, metal roofing, drywall, carpet, plumbing
- Wooden privacy fencing

The George County Board of Supervisors approved going out for debris removal and hauling bids at the November 2 meeting. This is the first official step of the FEMA funding procedure and the debris removal process. The Board anticipates a debris contractor to start work next month.

Weekly household garbage routes are running a regular schedule. County garbage crews may not be able to reach every home or business due to low hanging power lines, road debris, or working utility crews. Household garbage is not for storm debris.

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
