"Office Spotlight" Tax Assessor's Office



The George County Tax Assessor's Office is located on Main Street next to City Hall. It also serves as the office for the George County Solid Waste Department. Tax Assessor Vince Carlisle was elected to his first term in October 2011. The office is elected for four year terms by the county at large.

The department works together to appraise real and personal property within George County, administer homestead applications, and generate property maps. All property values and exemptions are administered as of an effective lien date of January 1 each year.

One common misconception is that the Assessor determines county budget and tax rates. This is not the



case. The Board of Supervisors, City Council, and School Board set the budgets for their respective jurisdiction and set the millage rates to generate revenue.

Mr. Carlisle is excited to have his office included in the County's new website; to be launched by the first of the year. With the website, residents can do an online tax search. This search engine will return tax information of record in George County.

The Tax Assessor Office is open Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. and is located at 5130 Main Street. The friendly staff can be reached at 601-947-7541.

Do You Know the Jelly Man?

Willie Ray Fairley, Beat 5 crewman, is an award winning jelly maker. He was recently awarded Best of Show at the George County Fair. This was Mr. Fairley's first entry and first win. He won with his unusual but colorful four flavor jelly. It consists of Apple, Plum, Pineapple, and Strawberry. It takes a full week to make this particular jelly. Mr. Fairley has been making jelly for about two years, first giving it away then eventually selling it. When ask how he came up with his name, Mr. Fairley said, " Everyone just knows me as the Jelly Man and it kind of stuck." He has several varieties of fruit trees he uses for his jellies. They sell for \$3.50 each and includes also Mayhaw, Crab Apple, Kumquat, Muscadine, Quince, Peach, Loguart, Blueberry, Mango, Lemon, Blackberry, Fig, and Watermelon. He also has an assortment of Hickory Smoked Meats for sale. George County Officially Opens Emergency Shelters

The George County Board of Supervisors officially opened two new Emergency Shelters on Dec. 10 with a ribbon cutting ceremony attended by dozens of community leaders. The Benndale Shelter is located on Hwy. 26 just east of the Hwy. 57 intersection and the Agricola Shelter is located at the intersection of Hwy. 613 and Cooks Corner Rd.

During an emergency, the shelters will be opened by the County's Emergency Management Agency (EMA) and staffed by the American Red Cross along with MS Dept. of Human Services. EMA Director Nancy Smith says the new shelters are a great addition to the current "Sheltering Plan."





Quarterly Recipe "Turnip Soup"

Ingredients:
